

## DOROTHY STRINGER SCHOOL

### BRIGHTON TOWN TRAIL

Walk down London Road until you see a large church on your left surrounded by grass.

- 1) *What is the name of this church?*
- 2) *What is the telephone number of the church?*
- 3) *What are the times of the Sunday services?*

Cross the road and take the street alongside "Domino's Pizza" (Trafalgar Road).

- 4) *What type of shop is on the corner opposite "Domino's Pizza"?*

On your left is Pelham Square.

- 5) *Which 4 things are not allowed in the square?*

Continue and turn left into Sydney Street

- 6) *What is "Yum Yum"?*
- 7) *How many flags hang outside the "Guarana" shop?*
- 8) *What is the "The Office"?*

At the end of Sydney Street turn right and you will see a mosaic on the ground.

- 9) *How many birds are in the mosaic?*

Turn left into Kensington Gardens. On the right is a café "Wai Kika Moo Kau".

- 10) *What would be the name of this café in correct English spelling?*

At the bottom of the street, turn right and then left into Gardner Street. Find the "Komedia"

- 11) *What is on at the "Komedia" this evening?*

Continue straight ahead and cross into Bond Street. At bottom of Bond Street, by HSBC bank, turn left and cross road at traffic lights. In front of you is a painted sign that says "Lanes".

- 12) *What shop is shown on this sign?*

Turn right at this sign into a narrow lane and continue to the "Bath Arms" pub.

- 13) *What is the unusual sign outside of this pub?*

Turn right at the "Bath Arms" and immediately opposite on your right is an old building, "The Font"

- 14) *When was this building built?*

Continue along this small street to the end and turn left, opposite "O'Neill's" pub. Then turn first left into Prince Albert Street. On the left is a building, the "Religious Society of Friends/ Friends Meeting House" with a garden in front of it.

- 15) *What does the religious group, the Quakers, believe, according to the notice on the board?*

Continue along Prince Albert Street

- 16) *Which sport is represented at the pub opposite "Zizzi"?*

- 17) *When was this pub built?*

Carry on until you come to a large white building on the right with columns.

- 18) *What is this building?*

## BRIGHTON TOWN TRAIL (2)

19) According to the blue plaque on this building, which other building used to stand near here and was burned down in 1514?

Opposite is the "Visitor Information Centre (Tourist Office)".

Go in and ask for a map of Brighton (one person per group, one map only).

Take the road opposite, called Bartholomews, then turn right at the "All Saints" shop into East Street. Go down to the seafront. Cross road at traffic lights and look down at beach. Ahead of you is a round green sculpture.

20) What food does this sculpture remind you of?

Go down slope on the right to the beach.

21) Find out what the word for "Karoussell" is in English?

22) When was this one built?

Just past the "Karoussell" on the right is a sign for "Prof Mirza".

23) What does Prof Mirza do?

Continue for about 100 metres and you will see a museum.

24) What type of museum is it?

25) What is the name of the large boat in the museum that you can see from the door?

26) When was the Brighton Fisherman's Society, next door, established?

Carry on until you see "Brighton Watersports".

27) Name 5 watersports that are offered here.

A bit further on there are public toilets if needed.

Continue until you find the "Seafront Office" on the right. There is a notice in the window.

28) What sort of weather is it when the "stones are wet"?

Carry on to the pier in ruins.

29) What is the name of this pier?

Walk past the pier, Alfresco Restaurant and children's playground. There is a green statue with wings opposite the "Meeting Place Café".

30) Who is this statue in memory of?

Cross the street at crossing in front of you and turn right. Walk along until you find Preston Street (not Little Preston Street) on your left. Turn left into Preston Street.

31) What type of building is this street full of?

Go to end of road and turn right at main shopping street, Western Road.

32) Find a shop on the opposite side of the street with a French name.

Walk along until you come to the shopping centre, Churchill Square.
